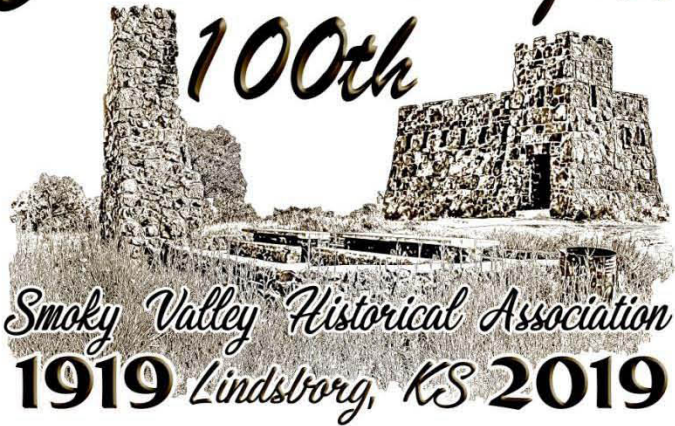


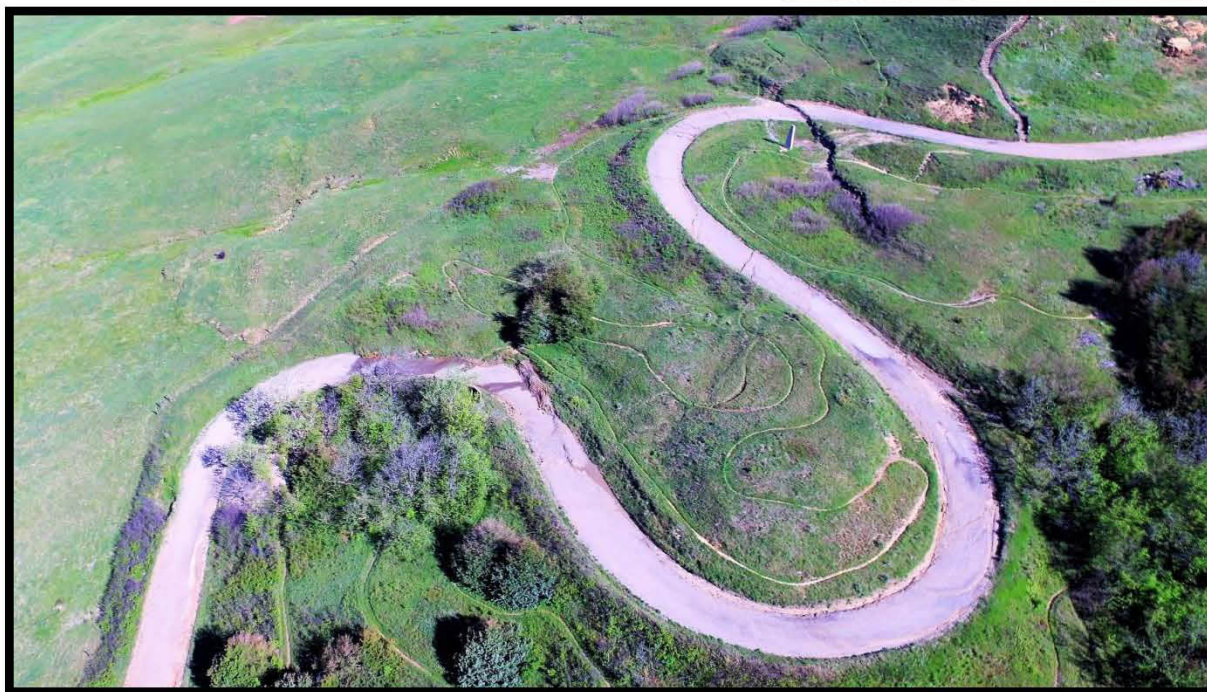

Suggested Giving Levels

Chris Abercrombie level Up to \$99.99

As President, Chris had many accomplishments including having Coronado Heights placed on the National Historic Register as well as recording many interviews with local persons of interest.

Dr. Duane Fredrickson level \$100 - \$499

"Doc" Fredrickson served on the board for over 45 years including serving as President several terms. He was instrumental in gaining ownership of Coronado Heights back from Saline Co. to SVHA. Doc cleaned and maintained Coronado Heights consistently to the end and left a legacy in Lindsborg for generations.

Elizabeth Jaderborg level \$500 - \$999

Mrs. Einar Jaderborg was instrumental in reorganizing the LHS to current SVHA in 1963 and was the founding director of the Lindsborg Swedish Folk dancers. She was also a historian and avid writer, as herself and Selma Lind.

Malcolm Esping level \$1,000 - \$4,999

Malcolm, it could be said, WAS Lindsborg History. He was instrumental in establishing the Old Mill Museum and a consummate story teller.

William Hagstrom level \$5,000 - \$9,999

Hagstrom was an innovator and inventor; his factory made and sold such things as spark plugs and lamp parts. He was one of the founding members of the Lindsborg Historical Society and came up with the name to Coronado Heights along with G.N. Malm.

Birger Sandzen level \$10,000 - \$24,999

Sandzen was a well known Midwest artist who helped organize and served on the first board of the Lindsborg Historical Society. The Memorial Gallery in Lindsborg honors his contributions to the art world.

Carl P. Eklund level \$25,000 - \$49,999

Eklund came to Lindsborg in 1917 to be the 1st Bi-lingual Pastor for the merged Methodist Churches. He instigated forming the Lindsborg Historical Society in 1919 and served as its 1st President. His persistent efforts brought many parks to Lindsborg including the Coronado Heights Park.

G.N. Malm level \$50,000 – plus

G.N. Malm was a tireless businessman, artist, and promoter of Lindsborg and Bethany College. He helped organize Lindsborg Historical Society and served as Secretary during the formative years. He, along with W. Hagstrom, gave the name to Coronado Heights.
