** Destination Lindsborg:

1. I-135 Interstate to Lindsborg, which becomes Old Highway 81- to Lincoln Street. (YesWay Filling Station on South of Lincoln, Brick Dental Bldg. on North side). Turn right (West) onto Lincoln for one mile. At one-half mile will be a stop sign at Main Street. Next stop will be at Coronado Ave. Turn left (South) onto Coronado Avenue for two blocks and the CrackerBox is on the right at Ahlstedt Sign.
2. From the North, either I-135 or drive South on Coronado Avenue - two blocks South past Lincoln Street in Lindsborg.
3. From the West, drive East on Highway 4, at Lindsborg, turning North onto Coronado Avenue - for two blocks.
